

# **TECH GATEWAY IS NOW OPEN**

Imagine living where you don't speak the language. Visualize yourself there: people whiz past you, connecting, laughing, communicating, or maybe yelling out a warning, and there you are, unable to understand a word of it. What might you feel? Isolated? Stagnant? It is not a stretch to suggest that digital literacy is equally imperative to our active engagement in the world as is language.

Technology requires a steep learning curve, and is costprohibitive for many, and this is even truer for those pursuing mental health recovery. How then do we address the disparity between those with access and those without? For a solution, we reached out to our amazing community partners.

The William G. & Marie Selby Foundation responded generously to our request with a \$100,000 grant to fund our "Gateway to the Future" initiative. Readers might remember that the Selby Foundation supported the creation of the Academy's culinary program in 2017 by funding the installation of our commercial kitchen. This most recent Selby Foundation grant


