### ACCENTUATE THE POSITIVE

Today we learned about how our positive thoughts and beliefs can shape our realities. Studies using visualization to improve a given outcome had two groups; both were asked to dunk a basketball. After an initial baseline assessment, one group had two weeks of basketball practice while the other group spent 20 minutes a day just visualizing themselves dunking the ball. The group that physically played ball improved 24%. But guess what? The other group, the ones that just visualized themselves succeeding, also improved, by a whopping 23%!

Another example is the story of the 4-minutes mile. Experts said it was physically impossible until Roger Bannister proved them wrong and ran a mile in 3:59. A year after Bannister broke the record, many others followed. Once the world saw that it was possible, it was.
